Camp	North Baltimore/Guilford/Homeland	Grades 10, 11, and 12	In partnership with Notre Dame of Maryland University (NDMU), this camp will expose Adelante Latina! students to college life and career options through campus tours, interactive presentations from a variety of NDMU professors and alumnae, and field trips.
Afrikan Youth Alchemy	Griot's Eye Youth Media Academy	Harbor East/Little Italy, Oldtown/Middle East	Grades 9, 10, 11, 12, and ages 18-24	Griot's Eye Youth Media Academy is an intensive digital media arts and advocacy program designed for youth 14-21 to ignite activism, cultural education, and entrepreneurship through digital learning.
The Baltimore Urban Leadership Foundation, aka The Door	Generation E4 (Education, Enrichment, Engineering, & Entrepreneurship) Summer Camp	Oldtown/Middle East, Patterson Park North & East	Grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7	This STEAM and literacy program engages youth through instruction, hands-on learning projects, character enrichment, club time, and fitness activities. Coding and robotics will play a key role as the camp's science theme for this summer.

Catherine's Family and Youth Services	Summer Youth Enrichment Program	Southern Park Heights	Grades 7 and 8	Small groups of youth will be paired with a local business to design and execute a logo for that business. Through developing and pitching their design, youth will exercise writing, public speaking, and graphic design skills.

Additionally, the program uses field trips to expand the girls' worldviews.

On Fridays, students attend field trips to places of cultural significance in and around Baltimore City. 7 <sup>th</sup> and 8 <sup>th</sup> grade students end the Academy with an overnight college visit, 5 <sup>th</sup> and 6 <sup>th</sup> graders end with a college day visit.

Additionally, the program offers a financial literacy and college transition support.
