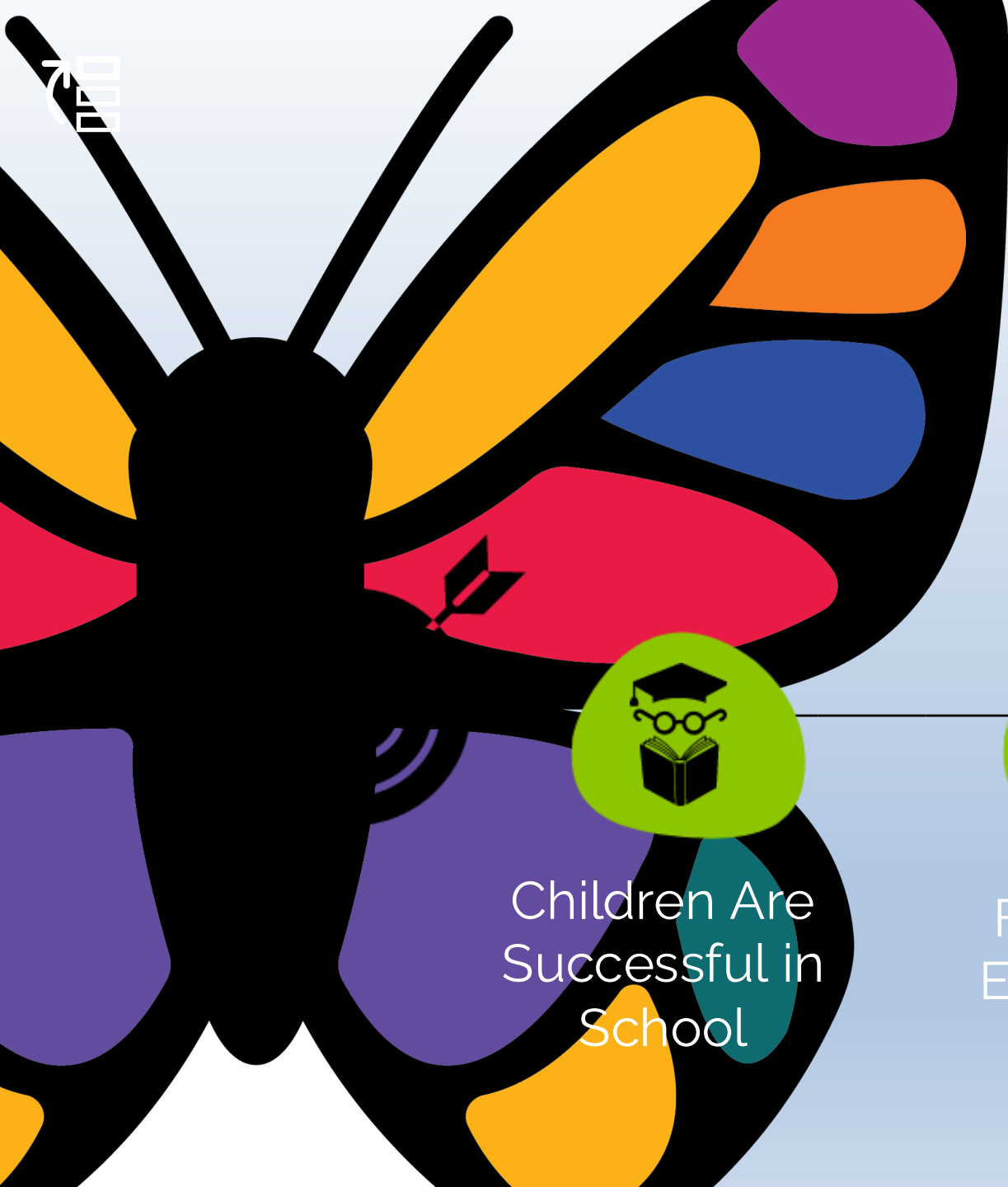

Thriving Youth Strategy

- Family League approaches this work through the lenses of prevention and early intervention by implementing a justice diversion program partnership strategy to address and respond to systemic inequities impacting Baltimore City youth with programming that supports youth in meeting their basic needs, accessing services, receiving education assistance, employment opportunities, mentoring and other supportive services to meet their immediate safety needs and provide positive engagement opportunities.
- Family League's Thriving Youth Strategy was implemented in FY21 and continues to focus on prevention initial involvement with the juvenile justice system and early intervention for young people who have been involved with the juvenile justice system with the goal of preventing future involvement.
- The strategy currently has four funded partners: [Baltimore Brothers](#), [the Mayor's Office of African American Male Engagement](#), [New Vision Youth Services](#), and [The Choice Jobs Program](#) at UMBC.

Thriving Youth Programs

Baltimore Brothers

- Curriculum is delivered through a Three-Part Model consisting of Identification, Empowerment, and Engagement to support youth in Baltimore.
- Provide participants weekly Empowerment Program Strategy focused in five (5) important areas for youth in: Housing, Legal Matters, Employment, Financial Wellness, and Education. Programming engagements also provide Social-Emotional and Mental Health services and referrals.

The Mayor's Office of African American Male Engagement

- Strategies are delivered to advance the educational and socioeconomic development of disconnected Boys, Youth, and Young Men, including those who panhandle ("Squeegee" youth in the City of Baltimore).
- Programming proactively supports the young person by assigning a Credible Mentor and Case Management Navigator to assist in acquiring resources and removing barriers that may obstruct participants' pathways to success.
- Provides participants with intensive case management, consistent engagement, and guidance/ access to financial resources.

The Choice Jobs Program

- Provides workforce training that consists of a seven-session curriculum-based job readiness course and on-the-job paid experience in one of three social enterprise locations (UB, Camden Yards, Conway Street Inner Harbor).
 - Participants receive a stipend upon completion of the 7-week sessions. Participants and the caregivers' complete needs assessments and Program staff engages families with resource brokering through the creation of the Service planning with individuals SMART goals established by the youth enrolled.

New Visions Youth Services

- Applies practices of the Positive Impact Movement (PIM), a 24/7 mentor restorative model with a mission to change the cultural environment of "high need" youth by eliminating violent and destructive behavior.
- New Visions delivers mentoring to high-need youth who require training that is relevant to establishing appropriate values and character. The New Vison Credible Mentor/ Mentee cohorts occur four times per year (Summer, Fall, Winter, and Spring) Weekly engagement: credible mentors and Disconnected Youth that Squeegee (DYTS) during and after school, monthly check-in with DYTS, and offers out-of-school time earns as you grow activities.

Project Description

The Thriving Youth Program Evaluator will:

Deliver:

- Development of research questions and a logic model in consultation with Family League
- Research and reporting on a landscape analysis of the impact of similar programming supporting Opportunity Youth in the region and in similar populations
- Development of an interview and/or focus group protocol and script
- Interview transcripts, thematic code book, and prevalence data on themes identified
- Documentation on existing data review and analysis
- A draft of the report on which Family League will provide feedback and assist with meaning-making if needed.
- A final public report that contains an executive summary, methodology, findings of the study, limitations, data visualizations, conclusions, and recommendations.
- A presentation to internal Family League staff on the findings of the evaluation
- A presentation to TYP partners on the findings of the evaluation.

Review:

- Program implementation data from July 1, 2019, to present
- quarterly program reports
- de-identified data on participants' enrollment, demographics, service utilization, referrals, justice system involvement, connection to work and school
- limited anonymous youth participant feedback survey responses and limited school attendance and academic records.

Application Requirements

In order to be considered for this opportunity, applicants must complete all application questions/components and provide the following documents :

- Researcher(s) resume and bio;
- Proposed budget for this project;
- Proposed timeline and outline of research process;
- A letter of reference dated within the past 12 calendar months;
- 1-2 samples of final reports for other projects that include mixed methods analysis and data visualization.
